**M**amlaka ya Usimamizi wa Bandari za Kenya (KPA) inatarajia kushughulikia majalada milioni 2.2 za futi ishirini (TEUs) kufikia mwisho wa 2024, kuashiria ongezeko la asilimia 20 kutoka utenda- kazi wa mwaka jana.

Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa KPA, Kapteni William Ruto, alifichua kwamba bandari tayari imevuka lengo la mwaka jana la TEU milioni 1.6, huku majalada ya sasa yakifikia TEU milioni 1.75.

Alihusisha ukuaji huo wa kuvutia na uboreshaji wa ufanisi wa uendeshaji na taratibu zilizowekwa katika kituo hicho.

"Ukuaji wa uchumi wa dunia uko kwa asilimia tano, huku ule wa Afrika Mashariki ukiwa kati ya asilimia tano na saba," akasema Ruto.

Aliongeza kuwa, katika kipindi cha miaka miwili iliyopita, mizigo imeongezeka kwa kiasi kikubwa hivi kwamba hivi karibuni itapita uwezo wa sasa wa bandari wa TEU milioni 2.1.

Akizungumza katika makao makuu ya KPA mjini Mombasa, Ruto alisema Mamlaka inajitahidi kuimarisha uwezo wa bandari hiyo kwa kupanua Kontena 1, pia inajulikana kama Berth Number 19B. Aliongeza kuwa hivi karibuni KPA itatia saina mkataba na mwanakandarasi wa kuongeza urefu wa mita 240, na kuongeza uwezo wa bandari kwa TEU 300,000 za ziada.

“Kabla sijachukua wadhifa wa Mkurugenzi Mkuu, bandari ilikuwa inahudumia TEU milioni 1.4. Kufikia mwisho wa mwaka wangu wa kwanza wa 2023, tulikuwa tumefikia TEU milioni 1.6, ukuaji wa asilimia 12 ikilinganishwa na asilimia 0.4 ya awali,” Ruto alisema.

Aidha alisema bandari

hiyo sasa inahudumia zaidi ya nchi nane za usafirishaji na soko la usafirishaji limekua kwa zaidi ya asilimia 35.

Ruto alisema Bandari hiyo pia inatekeleza maboresho makubwa yakiwemo ya kisasa ya Mfumo wa Uendeshaji wa Vituo na upatikanaji wa vifaa vya hali ya juu ili kuimarisha ufanisi wa utendaji kazi wa Bandari hiyo.

Alipothibitisha tena kujitolea kwa ufanisi wa utendakazi, upunguzaji wa gharama, na uendeleu wa mazingira kupitia uwekezaji wa kimkakati katika kituo kipya cha mafuta ambacho kimepunguza sana muda wa kusubiri wa meli, alibainisha kuwa KPA pia ime-shughulikia changamoto ya muda mrefu ya gharama kubwa za upunguzaji wa mafuta.

Gharama hizi, ambazo mara nyingi hupitishwa kwa watumiaji, zimechangia kihistoria kupanda kwa bei ya mafuta na bidhaa zinazohusiana. Kwa kupunguza ucheleweshaji huu, KPA inahakikisha kwamba

mzigo wa gharama kwa watumiaji wa mwisho unapunguzwa kwa kiasi kikubwa jambo ambalo limesababisha kushuka kwa gharama ya bidhaa za petroli.

“Uwekezaji wa KPA katika kituo cha mafuta ni dhihirisho la kujitolea kwake kwa kisasa, ukuaji wa uchumi, na utunzaji wa mazingira. Mradi huu unapoanza kutekelezwa, uko tayari kuimarisha nafasi ya Kenya kama kiongozi katika usimamizi wa bandari wenye ubunifu na endeleu barani Afrika,” Ruto alisema.

Alisema meli kadhaa hivi majuzi zimeanzisha huduma mpya katika Bandari hiyo, akisema kuwa licha ya kile kinachoendelea katika Bahari Nyekundu, KPA imeendelea kurekodi utendakazi ulioboreshwa.

Afisa Mtendaji Mkuu wa Baraza la Wasafirishaji kwa Meli Afrika Mashariki, Agayo Ogambi, alishukuru kwa ziara ya kituo hicho akisema mazungumzo ya Bandari yamesaidia kufuatilia utendaji na ufanisi wa bandari.

Akiangazia umuhimu wa biashara ndogo na za kati (SMEs) katika uchumi wa Kenya, Mang’eni alisema “SMEs huchangia pakubwa katika uchumi wetu. Kenya ina uwezo wa wafanyikazi milioni 20, lakini ni milioni 1 tu ndio walio katika utumishi wa umma. Kuinua sekta ya SME hadi sekta ya msingi ni hatua ya kutumia uwezo huu ambao haujatumiwa.”

Alitoa wito wa kuwepo kwa mbinu za makusudi, zenye mwelekeo wa kibashara, akiongeza kuwa maafisa wa serikali watakuwa uwanjani kwa siku mbili kuhamasisha umma juu ya fursa zilizopo.

Katibu pia alieleza mafanikio ya Hustler Fund, akifichua kuwa Wakenya milioni 24.6 wamekopa kutoka kwa hazina hiyo, na milioni 2 wakikopa kwa madhumuni ya biashara. “Tumetoa Sh56.7 milioni, na wakopaji

wanarejesha kwa bidii. Utamaduni huu wa kukopa na kurejesha kwa wakati unastahili pongezi,” alisema.

Ili kuadhimisha mwaka wa pili wa Mfuko wa Hustler baadaye mwezi huu, serikali itazindua bidhaa mpya, ‘The Bridge Loan,’ alisema.

Kituo hiki kitalenga wakopaji walio na historia nzuri ya urejeshaji, kuongeza mara tatu kiwango chao cha mkopo na kuongeza muda wa kurejesha hadi siku 30. Itatumika kama daraja la bidhaa ya mkopo ya SME, ambayo inatoa kiasi kikubwa cha fedha ili

kuboresha biashara.

Mang’eni aliwataka wananchi waunde vikundi maalumu vya kisekta kama vile vya ufugaji wa ng’ombe wa maziwa ili kusaidia serikali kutambua mahitaji yao na kupata soko la hakika la bidhaa zao. Pia alianga-zia mipango ya kuanzisha mikopo maalumu ili kuongeza thamani katika sekta kama vile maziwa, mafuta ya kula, na shughuli nyingine za utengenezaji. Mbunge wa eneo hilo Josses Lemengit, aliyehudhuria hafla hiyo, alitumia jukwaa kuzindua Mpango Mkakati wa Eneobunge 2023–2028.

### NOTICE TO IMPORTERS OF USED / SECONDHAND MOTOR VEHICLES

Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS) is a statutory body established under the Standards Act, Cap. 496, Laws of Kenya and it is mandated to offer among other services, quality inspection of imports based on Kenya Standards or approved specifications.

Pursuant to the provision of KS 1515:2000 - Kenya Standard Code of Practice for Inspection of Road Vehicles, and Legal Notice No.78 of 28<sup>th</sup> April 2020 - The Verification of Conformity to Kenya Standards of Imports Order, we wish to notify all importers of used / second-hand motor vehicles including returning residents, diplomatic staff and the general public that in observance of clause 2.5 of KS 1515:2000 on the eight (8) year age limit requirement, only Right Hand Drive (RHD) motor vehicles whose Year of First Registration is from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2018 and later shall be allowed into the country effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025.

Vehicles exported to Kenya shall be expected to comply with KS 1515:2000 — Kenya Code of Practice for Inspection of Road Vehicles while vehicles from countries where KEBS has an inspection agency (i.e. Japan, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom, Thailand, Singapore, and South Africa) shall be accompanied with a Certificate of Roadworthiness (CoR) issued by Quality Inspection Services Inc. Japan (QISJ) which is an inspection company contracted by KEBS.

Further, the Certificates of Roadworthiness for vehicles whose year of first registration is 2017 will not be valid after 31<sup>st</sup> December 2024. All vehicles issued with such certificates must arrive at the Port of Destination / Entry by 31<sup>st</sup> December 2024. Any vehicle registered in 2017 or earlier, arriving after 31<sup>st</sup> December 2024 will be deemed not compliant with KS 1515:2000 and shall be rejected at the importer's expense.

# Kenya yataka ushirikiano thabiti kulinda maslahi ya wanaofanya kazi ugenini

Katibu Mkuu wa Leba na Ustawi wa Ujuzi Shadrack Mwadime ametoa wito wa kupitishwa kwa mazoea mazuri katika ushirikiano wa uhamiaji wa wafanyakazi ili kuhakikisha ulinzi wa wafanyakazi wahamiaji dhidi ya aina zote za unyonyaji na unyanyasaji.

Kulingana na Katibu, ushirikiano wa uhamiaji wa wafanyakazi unahitaji kuhakikisha kazi zenye staha kwa wafanyakazi wahamiaji ili kuongeza mchango wao wa kijamii na kiuchumi katika nchi zao za asili na wanakoenda.

Akihutubia Ushirika wa Uhamiaji wa Ulaya (EMN) Kongamano la Kitaifa la Austria la 2024 jijini Vienna, Bw Mwadime alisema mikataba hiyo inakuza uhamiaji endelevu wa wafanyakazi na ukuzaji wa ujuzi kwa, miongoni mwa mambo mengine, kuanzisha njia halali za

uhamiaji.

“Njia wazi za kisheria za uhamiaji hupunguza uhamiaji usio wa kawaida, hulinda wafanyakazi dhidi ya unyonyaji na usafirishaji haramu, na kuhakikisha wanahamia kwa usalama, utaratibu na utaratibu wa kawaida,” aliuambia mkutano huo, uliokuwa na mada “Kufungua Uwezo wa Ubia wa Uhamiaji: Kuelekea Njia ya Kina.”

Alisema kuwa Ushirikiano wa Uhamiaji wa Ujuzi (SMPs) kati ya nchi unazidi kudhihirika huku ukilinganisha maendeleo ya ujuzi na mahitaji ya soko la ajira, katika nchi zinazotuma na kupokea.

Hii ni pamoja na

kuandaa programu zinazofaa za mafunzo. “Ushirikiano wa uhamiaji wa ujuzi huhakikisha kuwa wafanyakazi wana ujuzi na kukidhi mahitaji maalumu ya soko la wafanyakazi katika nchi inayofikiwa.”

Hata hivyo, licha ya manufaa yake, Bw. Mwadime alisikitika kwamba ushirikiano wa uhamiaji wa wafanyakazi unakabiliwa na changamoto kadhaa zinazoendelea kukwamisha utekelezaji wake kwa ufanisi.

Alitoa mfano wa wafanyakazi ambao wanaweza kuhama kwa njia zisizo za kawaida, kupita njia za kisheria, hivyo kufanya usimamizi wa uhamiaji kuwa mgumu.

Zaidi ya hayo, licha ya programu za mafunzo, kutolingana kati ya ujuzi wa wafanyakazi wahamiaji na mahitaji ya soko la ajira la nchi inayopokea kunaweza kusababisha wafanyakazi kuajiriwa katika kazi ambazo hazilingani na sifa au

Alizitaja nchi wanachama wa EU kwa kutambua ushirikiano wa uhamiaji wa ujuzi kama zana ya sera ya kukuza mbinu endelevu ya uhamiaji wenye ujuzi na uhamiaji, na kufaidisha nchi za asili na marudio.

“Nchi Wanachama wa EU zinakabiliwa na hitaji

### PUBLIC NOTICE CONFERMENT OF HONORARY DOCTORATE

The Technical University of Kenya is pleased to announce its intention to confer on Hon. Jared Benson Kangwana an Honorary Doctor of Business Administration degree (Honoris Causa) during the 13<sup>th</sup> Graduation Ceremony to be held on 26<sup>th</sup> November 2024. This conferment is in recognition of Hon. Kangwana's distinguished contribution to entrepreneurship and a free and independent media in Kenya.



Born in Nyaribari in 1949, Hon. Kangwana attended Kisii School where he sat his O-Level examination in 1970 and scored Division One and A-Level examination in 1972 and passed with 4 Principals. He was admitted to the University of Nairobi to study Law and graduated with an LLB Honours degree in 1975. After completing his post-graduate Diploma in Law in 1976, Kangwana was admitted to the Roll of Advocates. In 1977, Kangwana got a scholarship and joined the University of Edinburgh in Scotland to study a Master's Degree in Law (LLM). After he graduated with LLM degree, he joined the Kenya School of Law as a lecturer and later moved to the University of Nairobi as a law lecturer.

Through the 1980s and subsequent years, Kangwana served in many national and international public roles including: founding member of the Capital Markets Advisory (CMA) Board and thereafter a Board Member of the CMA, Member of the Presidential Working Party on Employment and Training in Kenya (Ndegwa Commission), Member of the Presidential Working Party on Education and Manpower Training for the next Decade and Beyond, Council Member of Kenyatta University, Honorary Treasurer and Council Member of Moi University, Council Member of Maseno University, and Member of the International Advisory Council to then President of the USA, Ronald Reagan.

During this period and to date Hon. Kangwana has been an entrepreneurial pioneer building a conglomerate enterprise and serving in various public and private roles including: Chairman of the Kenya Times Media Trust, founder of and Executive Chairman of Trans-National Bank, Chairman of the American Life Insurance Company, founder and Executive Chairman of the Kenya Television Network (Africa's first private free-to-air television station), Board Member of the International Telecommunications Satellite Organisation (INTELSAT) and Member of the Advisory Council to the African Development Bank. Kangwana's current business interests span real estate, hospitality, financial services and music publishing.

- (3) **Corporate Governance Guidelines & Code of Conduct for the Tea Sector and the Regulatory Impact Statement on the Guidelines & Code of Conduct for the Tea Sector.**  
The purpose of the Corporate Governance Guidelines and Code of Conduct is to provide for enhanced accountability in the tea sector and align it with best corporate government practices to pave way for a revitalized and ethically governed industry. The Regulatory Impact Statement contains detailed information on the anticipated impacts of the Corporate Governance Guidelines and Code of Conduct.

- (4) **Manuals for election of persons to represent Small-Scale and Medium Scale Tea Growers, Large Scale Tea Growers and Tea Traders in the Board;**  
The Purpose of the Manuals is to provide election requirements, principles, processes, and dispute resolution mechanisms for election of persons to represent Small-Scale and Medium Scale Tea Growers, Large Scale Tea Growers and Tea Traders at the Tea Board of Kenya.

Mamlaka ya Maendeleo ya Pwani (CDA) inatafuta ushirikiano wa kimkakati ili kufufua na kupanua mipango yake muhimu inayolenga kuongeza mapato ya kilimo, kuboresha upatikanaji wa maji, na kuimarisha uwezo wa jamii.

Kwa sasa, CDA inatekeleza miradi ya usimamizi wa maji na unyunyizaji maji katika Kaunti za Tana River, Taita Taveta, Kilifi, Kwale na Lamu. Juhudi hizi zimeundwa ili kuhakikisha uthabiti, kuongezeka kwa uzalishaji wa chakula ili kukidhi mahitaji yanayooongezeka ya eneo hilo.

Lengo kuu la kazi ya CDA ni Mradi wa Unyunyizaji kwa Wakulima Wadogo wa Boji katika Kaunti ya Tana River, ambao kwa sasa unanufaisha zaidi ya wakulima 500 katika zaidi ya ekari 200 za mashamba yenye rutuba.

unakabiliwa na changamoto kubwa kutokana na kubadilishwa kwa mkondo wa Mto Tana, ambao umetatiza upatikanaji wa maji kwa ajili ya umwagiliaji. Kutokana na hali hiyo, Kaimu Mkurugenzi Mtendaji wa CDA Pamela Ngure amesisitiza umuhimu wa kuwepo kwa ushirikiano wa kimkakati ili kuondokana na vikwazo hivyo.

Bi. Ngure alisisitiza dhamira ya CDA ya ku-

panua unyunyizaji na maendeleo ya maji huku ikianzisha upya miradi iliyokuwa imekwama kama sehemu ya mkakati mpana wa mamlaka hiyo ili kuimarisha usalama wa chakula katika eneo zima la pwani.

“Wakati mradi wa Boji uko katika nafasi nzuri kutokana na hali ya hewa nzuri ya eneo hilo na udongo wenye rutuba, kuhama kwa mkondo wa mto kumetatiza usamba-

zaji wa maji kwa ajili ya unyunyizaji,” akasema Ngure.

Alisema miradi ya unyunyizaji ina uwezo mkubwa wa usalama wa chakula, uzalishaji mali, kupunguza umaskini na kuongeza ajira katika kanda.

“Tunatafuta ushirikiano na wadau mbalimbali na washirika ili kurejesha na kupanua mradi huo, kuhakikisha kuwa unaweza kuendelea kutoa thamani kwa wakulima na jamii inayohudumia,” alisema.

Mradi wa Unyunyizaji wa Boji kwa muda mrefu umekuwa nguzo ya maendeleo ya kilimo katika Kaunti ya Tana River, ukivapa wakulima wa eneo hilo fursa ya kulima mazao mwaka mzima, bila kujali mabadiliko ya msimu wa mvua.

Mradi huo unasaidia uchumi wa ndani kwa kuongeza uzalishaji wa chakula na kutoa chanzo cha uhakika cha mapato kwa mamia ya wakulima wadogo.

Hata hivyo, mabadiliko ya mkondo wa mto yamesababisha changamoto katika kupata ugavi thabiti na wa hakika wa maji, na

kutishia uwezekano wa mradi huo kudumu kwa muda mrefu.

Ngure anasema CDA, pamoja na washirika wake, imejikita katika kutafuta ufumbuzi endelevu wa kushughulikia masuala ya upatikanaji wa maji, kwa lengo la kuongeza ufanisi na ukubwa wa mfumo wa umwagiliaji.

Alisema kuimarisha Mradi wa Unyunyizaji wa Boji ni muhimu sio tu kwa kuboresha mazao ya kilimo lakini pia

kwa kupata vyanzo vya chakula na kusaidia ustawi wa kijamii na kiu-chumi wa wakazi.

Mbali na mradi wa Boji, CDA inaongoza miradi mingine kadhaa inayolenga maji na kilimo katika Tana River ambayo inalenga kushughulikia changamoto za eneo kama vile ukame, uhaba

wa maji, na ukosefu wa chakula.

Juhudi hizi ni muhimu kwa maendeleo ya muda mrefu ya kanda.

Ngure alidokeza kuwa moja ya mpango huo ni Wayuboru Water Pan, rasilimali muhimu kwa watu na mifugo.

Iko katika Kaunti ya Tana River, sufuria ya maji inahudumia wakazi 3,000 na hutoa maji kwa zaidi ya ng'ombe 8,000 na kondoo na mbuzi 10,000.

Imekuwa njia muhimu ya maisha wakati wa kiangazi, ikitoa maji yanayohitajika sana kwa jamii, na kuhakikisha unastahimili ukame na kuendelea katika elimu, kwani watoto hawahitaji tena kutumia muda mrefu kutafuta maji.

Alisema sufuria ya maji ni mfano wa jinsi rasilimali za maji za kimkakati zinaweza kuimarisha afya ya jamii na matokeo ya elimu.

Ahadi ya CDA kushughulikia mahitaji ya jamii Tana River ilian-gaziwa wakati wa ziara ya hivi majuzi ya Kamati ya Kitaifa ya Idara ya Maendeleo ya Mkoa ikiongozwa na mwenyekiti na Mbunge wa Sigor Peter Lochaka-pong.

Kamati ilikagua Mradi wa Boji na miradi mingine inayosimamiwa na CDA katika mkoa huo.

The Kenya Medical Practitioners and Dentists Council is a body corporate established under Section 3 of the Medical Practitioners and Dentists Act (CAP 253, Laws of Kenya). The mandate of the Council is to regulate the training and practice of medicine, dentistry and community oral health. The Council is also mandated by CAP 253 to regulate health facilities within the Republic of Kenya. The Health Act 2017 defines a health facility as the whole or part of a public or private institution, building or place, whether for profit or not, that is operated or designed to provide in-patient or out-patient treatment, diagnostic or therapeutic interventions, nursing, rehabilitative, palliative, convalescent, preventative or other health service.

The attention of the Council has been drawn to reports of medical and or dental services being offered in facilities that are not registered and licensed to do so.

This is to notify the public that:

- Section 22 (5) of CAP 253 stipulates that a person who uses premises as a health institution which premises is not licensed as a health institution commits an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a **fine not exceeding ten million shillings or imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years or to both**.
- Medical and dental services can only be provided in health facilities that are registered and licensed to operate in Kenya. Standalone **laboratories** and **pharmacies** are registered and licensed within their regulatory framework for the specific purposes of **diagnostic testing and medication dispensing**.
- Invasive procedures such as those involving injection of medications, procedures requiring local anaesthetics and procedures on teeth are considered medical services and are required to be undertaken in health facilities and by practitioners that are registered and licensed. Some of these procedures include liposuction, botox, facial rejuvenation, micro needling, hair transplant, laser hair removal, dental waxing, teeth whitening, placement of dental braces or implants among others.

**1.1 Background and Context**

The "Natural Products Industry (NPI) Initiative for Kenya" is a flagship project under the Kenya Vision 2030 development blueprint as incorporated in Medium Term Plan IV 2023-2027 and the Government's Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BeTA). This agenda is also cascaded in the National Museums of Kenya Strategic Plan 2023-2027. Kiwango cha mfumuko wa bei kinatarajiwa kusalia ndani ya kiwango kinacholengwa cha asilimia 2.5 juu au chini ya lengo la asilimia 5, na viwango vya ubadilishaji wa fedha za kigeni vinatarajiwa kubaki thabiti.

Eneo la Ngomeni, Kaunti ya Kilifi linatazamiwa kuwa mwenyeji wa makavazi ya kwanza ya chini ya maji Afrika Kusini mwa Jangwa la Sahara, huku kukiwa na maendeleo makubwa tayari katika awamu ya awali ya utafiti.

Katika kipindi cha wiki mbili zilizopita, wataalamu kutoka Makavazi ya Kitaifa ya Kenya (NMK) na washirika wao wamekuwa wakichunguza mabaki ya meli inayoaminika kuzama katika Bahari ya Hindi karibu na ufuo wa Ngomeni karibu miaka 500 iliyopita.

Mkuu wa Akiolojia Pwani katika Makavazi ya Kitaifa ya Kenya (NMK), anaongoza timu katika juhudi za kubaini ukubwa wa meli hiyo na kubaini iwapo ilitumika kwa madhumuni ya kibiashara au kijeshi.

Timu hiyo pia inachunguza mazingira ya kuzama kwa meli hiyo mnamo 1524, na matokeo ya mapema yanaonyesha moto, kwani vipande vya mbao vilivyochomwa vimepatika.



Wapenzi wa masuala ya urithi wa kitamaduni wa chini ya maji wastaajabia baadhi ya vitu vilivyopatikana ndani ya meli ya Ureno iliyozama katika ufuo wa eneo la Ngomeni, Kaunti ya Kilifi, miaka 500 iliyopita. na makaburi, wanaweza pia kuthamini na kufurahia urithi wa chini ya maji,” akasema.

Alisema baada ya utafiti huo, Makavazi ya Kitaifa ya Kenya yatajenga mfano wa ajali ya meli hiyo, ikiwezekana Ras Ngomeni, ili watakaotembelea eneo hilo wasione jengo bali mfano wa meli ya awali itakayokuwa na baadhi ya vitu vinavyopatikana chini ya maji.

“Hilo litawezekana meli ya iliyo chini ya maji ikihifadhiwa ili wageni wanaotaka kuona waweze kujitosa ndani ya bahari kuona kwa sababu tukiondoa mbao kutoka chini ya maji kuzileta ufuoni, zitaharibika,” akasema.

Serikali imetoa miongozo ya utunzaji kamili wa watoto wachanga ili kupunguza vifo vya watoto wachanga. Waziri wa Afya Deborah Barasa alisema kifurushi cha mafunzo ya utunzaji wa watoto wachanga kimeundwa ili kuwapa wafanyikazi wa afya ujuzi unaohitajika kutunza watoto wachanga. Dkt Barasa, ambaye aliandamana na Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa Afya Patrick Amoth na Gavana Wanga, alizindua mwongozo huo katika uwanja wa Chuo cha Mafunzo ya Matibabu cha Homa Bay. Uzinduzi huo ulifanyika wakati wa maadhimisho ya siku ya watoto kabla ya wakati duniani, yenye lengo la kuongeza uelewa wa kuzaliwa kabla ya wakati. Dk Barasa alisema watoto walio chini ya umri wa miaka mitano ndio chanzo kikuu cha vifo

Kulingana na Wizara ya Afya, asilimia 12 ya watoto wote wanaozaliwa hai kila mwaka wanazaliwa kabla ya wakati ambapo Ripoti ya Utafiti wa Demografia na Afya ya Kenya ikionyesha kiwango cha vifo vya watoto wachanga cha vifo 21 kwa kila watoto 1000 wanaozaliwa hai ambayo husababisha asilimia 51 ya vifo vya watoto chini ya miaka mitano. nchi. Waziri alisisitiza umuhimu wa maziwa ya mama na usaidizi wa kupumua kupitia matumizi ya mashine na utoaji wa oksijeni inapohitajika. Katika uzinduzi huo, Wizara pia ilisambaza mashine za CPAP kwa watoto ili kuwasaidia wenye matatizo ya kupumua baada ya kuzaliwa. “Tumeboresha ufuatiliaji wa viashiria vya matunzo ya watoto wachanga kupitia kuandaa ukusanyaji wa takwimu sanifu na ufuatiliaji katika vituo vyote vya kulaza,” akasema Dkt Barasa.

Dkt Amoth kwa upande wake alisema nchi inapaswa kuweka juhudi zaidi ili kupunguza idadi ya watoto wanaofariki wakati wa kuzaliwa. Alisema inasikitisha kuwa Homa Bay ni mjawapo ya kaunti zinazoongoza kwa vifo vya watoto wachanga katika vifo 26 kwa kila watoto 1000 wanaozaliwa wakiwa hai. Kulingana na Wizara ya Afya, wanawake 10 hupoteza maisha yao kila siku, huku zaidi ya robo tatu ya wagonjwa wakipatikana katika viwango vya juu.

Hata hivyo, kuwekeza katika utafiti kunahakikisha kwamba mikakati ya kukabiliana na ugonjwa huo inategemea ushahidi na yenye uwezo wa kutoa matokeo yanayopimika, akasema Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa Afya Dkt Patrick Amoth.

Katika hotuba yake iliyosomwa kwa niaba yake na Dkt Gladwell Gathecha, Kaimu Mkuu wa Kitengo cha Magonjwa Yasiyo ya Kuambukiza katika Wiz-

ara ya Afya, Dkt. Amoth alisisitiza kuwa Shirika la Afya Duniani, kupitia Mkakati wa Kimataifa wa Kuangamiza Saratani ya Mlango wa Kizazi wa 2020, imeweka mpango wa kushughulikia ugonjwa huo kama suala la afya ya umma.

“Inaleta mzigo mkubwa wa kiafya na kijamii na kiuchumi kwa familia, jamii, na taifa, lakini inaweza kukingwa na kutibiwa kupitia hatua zilizowekwa vizuri kama vile chanjo ya HPV, upimaji wa HPV, uchunguzi wa mapema, na matibu kwa wakati,”

**Tumeweza pia kupanua huduma za upimaji katika vituo vya afya mashinani-Amoth**

akasema.

“Mkakati huo unaweka lengo la kutoa chanjo ya 90% ya wasichana dhidi ya HPV kufikia umri wa miaka 18, kupima 70% ya wanawake wanaostahili, na kuhakikisha 90% ya wale waliogunduliwa na saratani au saratani ya vamizi wanapata matibu kwa wakati ifikapo 2030,” akafichua.

Dkt. Amoth alisema Kenya imejitolea kutekeleza majukumu hayo ya kimataifa kupitia mifumo ya sera ikiwemo Sera ya Kitaifa ya Saratani ambayo inaendeshwa kati ya 2019 na 2030 na Mkakati wa Kitaifa wa Kudhibiti Saratani ambayo hutoa msingi wa kushughulikia saratani ya shingo ya kizazi.

“Kwa kuzingatia sera hii, Kenya imefikia hatua muhimu katika kupambana na ugonjwa huo,” aliongeza, akiangazia hatua

muhimu zilizofikiwa ikiwa ni pamoja na kuendesha mpango wa chanjo ya HPV, huku asilimia 75 ya wasichana waliobalehe wakipokea dozi ya kwanza na asilimia 25 wakipokea chanjo hiyo. dozi ya pili.

Wakati huo huo alisema nchi inapita kwa dozi moja ya chanjo ya HPV ambayo inatarajiwa kuboresha chanjo na kuanzishwa kwa upimaji wa HPV kama njia yenye ufanisi zaidi ya uchunguzi ambayo itawezesha utambuzi wa mapema wa watu binafsi wa HPV.

Zaidi ya hayo, DG alisisitiza utafiti na ushirikiano kama msingi wa juhudi za wadau katika kukabiliana na saratani ya mlango wa kizazi kwa kuwa Mkakati wa Kitaifa wa Kudhibiti Saratani un-

asisitiza ujumuishaji wa taarifa za kimkakati, usajili na ufuatiliaji na mipango thabiti ya utafiti.

“Tafiti shirikishi za taa-sisi kama vile Cambridge, Chuo Kikuu cha Aga Khan, Chuo Kikuu cha Nairobi miongoni mwa zingine zimetoa maarifa muhimu kuhusu kuenea kwa HPV, ufanisi wa chanjo na ufanisi wa programu za uchunguzi,” akasema.

Dkt Amoth alisisitiza kuwa serikali za kaunti ni muhimu katika vita dhidi ya saratani ya mlango wa uzazi na kama walezi wa mifumo ya afya iliyogatuliwa, kaunti zina jukumu muhimu katika kupambana na saratani.

By virtue of the High Court ruling, the Authority draws the attention of persons wishing to deal in GMO products to the provisions of Biosafety Act, 2009 Sections 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23 and 50 and the Regulations made thereunder which require such persons to make applications to the Authority for approval to deal with the said products. Take notice that it is an offence under Section 52 of the Biosafety Act for any person to deal in GMOs or their derived products without the written approval of the Authority.

The Authority affirms to Kenyans that following the High Court ruling, it shall discharge its mandate of ensuring safety of human, animal health and protection of the environment in accordance with the Biosafety Act.

Wavumbuzi wengine wa mfumo huu ambao ulionyeshwa wakati wa Maonyesho ya hivi majuzi ya RVIBS Tech ni Bw Charles Munyora na Bi Gladys Daisi.

Katika maonyesho hayo, Bi Susan Muthami na Bw. Martin Kyalo walieleza hadhira yao utendaji kazi wa mfumo wa usalama unaotumia Mfumo wa Kimataifa wa

Hakuna kitu cha kutia moyo kwa mtu kujua kwamba mali yake iko salama na shwari, akasema.

Bw Kyalo alieleza kuwa mfumo huo wa kuzuia wizi humjulisha mwenye nyumba kunapokuwa

na mvamizi ndani ya nyumba kwa kuwa umewekwa vitambua mwendo na vitambuzi ambavyo hutuma ujumbe kwa simu ya mkononi au kompyuta ya mwenye nyumba.

Wanafunzi hao watatu, wote wanaosomea Taaluma ya Mtandao (IoT) na Robotics katika RVIBS wamenufaika na mpango wa ufadhili wa Benki ya Dunia wa SKIES uliofadhiliwa na

Benki ya Dunia kwa Sh6.5 milioni.

SKIES, ambayo inatekelezwa na Wizara ya Uwekezaji, Biashara na Viwanda kupitia Idara ya Serikali ya Viwanda, inalenga kuimarisha ubunifu wa miundombinu ya mfumo wa ikolojia kwa kujenga uwezo wa wapatanishi 13 wa Kenya kama vile incubators, accelerators, na watoa huduma za kambi za mafunzo ya teknolojia.

Kupitia Mradi wa Kenya Industrial and Entrepreneurship Project (KIEP), mpango huu unasaidia wasuluhishi hawa ambao pia wanajumuisha vyuo vikuu vinane na vyuo 500 vya ngazi ya kati katika kuanzisha na kuimarisha nguvu zao za uendeshaji na miundo ya biashara binafsi, kuhakikisha uendeleu wa uendeshaji, upanuzi na kuboreshwa. ubora wa huduma zinazotolewa.

Bw. Munyora alieleza kuwa mfano waliobuni unaweza kuwasaidia wakulima katika kuendeshia mfumo ya umwagiliaji otomatiki na kufuatilia unyevunyevu wa udongo.

“Kimsingi, tumeunda mfumo ambao unaepuka unyunyizaji maji mengi au kidogo kwa mimea. Mfumo huo pia una kihisi cha mvua kilichoundwa ili kuzima pampu za maji wakati wowote mvua inaponyesha. Hii ni kuepuka upotevu na kuimarisha uhifadhi wa maji ambayo hatua kwa hatua inakuwa rasilimali adimu,” akafafanua.

Bw Munyora ana imani kuwa mfano waliobuni unaweza kudhibiti hali kiotomatiki katika greenhouse na kumwezesha mkulima kufuatilia hali kwa mbali kwani halijoto inapopanda husababisha

mifumo ya uingizaji hewa ili kupoeza vifaa hivyo.

“Majaribio yetu ya awali yamethibitisha kuwa pia inakagua ubora wa hewa na inahakikisha uingizaji hewa unaofaa. Wakati halijoto inashuka chini ya viwango visivyofaa, huchochea mfumo wa joto kiotomatiki. Ikiwa nyumba ya kijani kibichi ni moto sana au baridi sana mkulima ataari-fiwa,” mvumbuzi huyo mchanga alifafanua.

Bw Munyora alisema mfumo huo unawawezesha wakulima kudhibiti greenhouse na simu janja kupitia programu ambayo ni rafiki kwa mtumiaji ambayo ni rahisi kueleweka na kufanya kazi. Zaidi zaidi, wakulima wanaweza kuingia katika akaunti zao na kudhibiti chafu kutoka hapo au kupitia SMS.

Mkulima anaweza kuchagua kudhibiti shamba moja kwa moja, ambapo shamba linajidhibiti kulingana na hali bora ya mazao.

Arifa hutumwa kwa mkulima kupitia programu au SMS. Kwa upande mwingine, inaweza kudhibitiwa kwa mikono ambapo, kwa mfano, mkulima anaweza kuweka joto hadi nyusi 24 au unyevu wa udongo kwa thamani fulani.

## Nchi za Afrika Mashariki zategemea usafiri wa majini kupunguza gesi ya kaboni

Nchi Wanachama wa Jumuiya ya Afrika Mashariki (EAC) zimesisitiza haja ya kuimarisha Uchukuzi Kupitia Njia za Maji (IWT) kama mkakati wa kupunguza utoaji wa gesi ya kaboni katika eneo zima.

Andrea AguerAriik, Naibu Katibu Mkuu wa EAC anayeshughulikia sekta za miundombinu, uzalishaji, kijamii na kisiasa, alisisitiza kwamba IWT inatoa njia mbadala ya kuhifadhi mazingira badala ya uchukuzi wa barabara na reli.

Alisema uchukuzi wa majini hutumia nishati mara sita chini ya usafiri wa barabara na mara mbili ya reli, na uzalishaji wake wa kaboni kwa jumla ni wa chini kuliko njia nyingine za uchukuzi.

Alisisitiza kwamba uchukuzi wa majini una ahadi kubwa ya kuhimisha bidhaa nyingi kwa wingi kupitia njia fupi za baharini na kukatizwa kidogo.

Kutokana na kuimarishwa kwa miundomsingi katika Ziwa Victoria, anaamini kuwa eneo hili linaweza kuzalisha biashara ya kila mwaka yenye thamani ya dola 60 bilioni za Amerika, na wakati huo huo kuongeza idadi ya watalii. Akizungumza wakati wa mkutano wa pembeni katika Kongamano la COP29 jijini Baku, Azerbaijan, Ariik alisema mitandao ya uchukuzi ya eneo hili inaweza kuimarisha maziwa na mito ili kuimarisha ushirikiano na biashara.

Aidha, ukarabati wa meli kama MV Uhuru I, ingawa mifumo ya

barabara na reli inahitaji marekebisho na uboreshaji wa kila mara, njia za maji zinazoweza zinahitaji uwekezaji mdogo sana na zinaweza kuunganishwa kwa urahisi na viungo vya barabara na reli zilizopo,” akasema.

Alisema nchi za EAC zimepiga hatua kubwa katika kuimarisha Usafiri wa Majini kupitia Ukarabati wa bandari muhimu zikiwemo Kisumu, Mwanza na Port Bell, ambazo zimeboresha kwa kiasi kikubwa usafiri wa maji katika Ziwa Victoria.

Ujenzi wa Bandari mpya ya Bukasa nchini Uganda, aliongeza, utaanzisha mfumo wa usafiri wa kutegegemea, madhubuti na endelevu wa njia nyingi katika Ukanda wa Kati na Kaskazini.

Aidha, ukarabati wa meli kama MV Uhuru I,

MV Umoja, MV Victoria, MV Butiama, pamoja na kuanzishwa kwa meli mpya za mizigo na abiria kama MV Mwanza na MV Uhuru II, alisema ni viashiria chanya.

Aliongeza kuwa kuzinduliwa kwa meli mbili za mafuta, MT KabakaMutebi II na Mlima Elgon, zenye ujazo wa takriban lita milioni 10 kutaimarisha usafirishaji wa mafuta kutoka Bohari ya Bomba la Kenya Kisumu hadi Port Bell nchini Uganda kupitia Ziwa Victoria, na kuondoa mamia ya malori, ambayo ni nyuma ya kuongezeka

kwa uzalishaji wa kaboni katika eneo hilo, kutoka barabarani.

“Meli hizi zimeondoa ipasavyo lori 300 za mafuta barabarani, na hivyo kupunguza uchafuzi wa mazingira,” alisema na kuongeza kuwa uwekezaji mwingine muhimu ni pamoja na ujenzi na uboreshaji wa vifaa vya kukauka katika bandari za Mwanza na Kisumu, pamoja na uanzishaji unaoendelea wa Mari-time. Vituo vya Kuratibu Uokoaji Mwanza, Entebbe na Kisumu.

Kando na Ziwa Victo-

ria, Mto Akagera unaoipitia Rwanda, Tanzania na Uganda, na Mto Nile unaopitia nchi 11, una uwezo wa kuleta manufaa makubwa kwa Afrika, alisema.

“Baada ya kutengenezwa kikamilifu, njia hizi za maji zinaweza kuboresha matumizi ya maliasili za bara hili, na kusababisha kuongezeka kwa maendeleo na ukuaji wa uchumi,” akasema Ariik.

Hata hivyo, alisema Ustawi wa maji wa njia za majini unatatizwa na ukosefu wa fedha za kurekebisha miundomsingi na bandari za bara.

Changamoto nyingine ni pamoja na ukosefu wa mfumo wa udhibiti wa kikanda na uhaba wa wafanyakazi wenye sifa, jambo ambalo linaweza kikomo uwezo wa sasa na wa siku zijazo wa urambazaji wa ndani ya nchi, alibainisha.

Aliomba ushirikiano kati ya wadau wa maendeleo na Tume ya Ziwa Victoria (LVBC) ili kutatua changamoto hizo kwa ufanisi.



# Waziri aahidi kwamba atahakikisha Bwawa la Umaa limekamilishwa kwa wakati uliowekwa

Waziri wa Maji na Unyunyizaji, Mhandisi Eric Mugaa, amesisitiza kuji-tolea kwa serikali kuka-milisha Mradi wa Maji wa Bwawa la Umaa Kaunti ya Kitui, uliokuwa umekwama miaka iliyopita.

Akizungumza wakati wa ziara ya kukagua bwawa hilo, Waziri Mugaa aliahidi kuhakikisha kuwa ujenzi hautakwama tena.

“Mkandarasi hana kisingizio cha kuchelewesha kazi, kwani tumelipia kazi zote zilizokamilika, na tumejipanga kuhakikisha ufadhili ili mradi ukamilike kama ilivyopangwa,” akasema Mhandisi Mugaa.

Waziri aliongeza kuwa tathmini inayoendelea na ufuatiliaji wa mradi ni muhimu ili kutatua changamoto zozote, kuhakikisha mradi unaendelea bila kuchelewa zaidi na kwamba makosa ya zamani hayarudiwi.

Alisema kuwa, kwa sababu sasa pesa ziko, mkandarasi hanatakuwa

kisingizio chochote cha kuongeza muda kwani hali hiyo inasababisha kuongezeka kwa gharama za mradi na kero nyingine zinazoambatana nazo.

Katika ziara hiyo, Mugaa alithibitisha kuwa kazi inaendelea huku bwawa la kuhifadhi maji likiwa limekamilika na kazi ya kuchimba visima ikien-delea vizuri.

Waziri alitaka Mamlaka ya Kitaifa ya Uvunaji na Uhifadhi wa Maji, ambayo ndiyo wakala wa utekelezaji, itumie mvua ya msimu mfupi inayoendelea kwa kupanda miti kando ya eneo la vyanzo vya maji karibu na bwawa hilo ili kuhakikisha uhi-fadhi wa mazingira endelevu.

Mradi huo wa Sh1.9-bilioni ambao uko kando ya Mto Nzeu, katika Kaunti ya Kitui, una uwezo wa lita bilioni 1.2 za maji na usambazaji wa lita 2, 650,000 kwa siku kuhudumia watu 75,000 katika Kaunti ya Kitui.

Mradi wa ujenzi wa bwawa hilo ulianza mwaka

2009 lakini ulikwama kwa zaidi ya miaka kumi kutokana na mgogoro kati ya mkandarasi na Mamlaka ya Kitaifa ya Uvunaji na Hifadhi wa Maji.

Mgogoro huo ulisababisha kesi mahakamani ambayo hatimaye iliishia kwenye usuluhishi ambapo pande hizo mbili zilishauriwa kufikia mufaka na kusitisha mkataba huo ili kupisha njia kwa mkandarasi mpya.

Mkataba huo ulikati-shwa baada ya mkandarasi wa kwanza kufanya kazi hadi asilimia 68 kwa gharama ya Sh566 milioni.

Kazi zinazoendelea zinafanywa na mkandarasi mpya, China Jiangxi International kwa gharama ya Sh1.9 bilioni na mradi huo utakamilika katika muda wa miaka miwili (2026).

Bwawa la Umaa ni majawapo ya miradi kuu ya Vision 2030 inayolenga kuboresha usambazaji wa maji kwa matumizi ya nyumbani na umwagiliaji katika kaunti ya Kitui ambayo ni nusu kame.

### LAUNCH OF THE NATIONAL AGROECOLOGY STRATEGY FOR FOOD SYSTEM TRANSFORMATION 2024-2033

Kenya's Food system has progressively evolved over the years but continues to be constrained by numerous endogenous and exogenous factors. There is increasing recognition that the food system, the way we produce, distribute and consume food as a country, is not sustainable and is therefore unable to sufficiently meet the needs of the country's growing population as we move into the future. Reports show that while agricultural output grew by 10% from 2018-2022, the burden of malnutrition continues to persist and the proportion of the population with severe food insecurity increased from 15% in 2016 to 28% in 2022.

Kenya's food system is heavily impacted by global climate change while also contributing to a larger share (over 60%) of GHGs and biodiversity loss. The intensity of extreme weather events including droughts, heavy rains and floods have worsened over the years with serious negative effects on food security and the ecosystem.

Kenya has committed to the transformation of Country's food system within the framework of agreed global and regional frameworks such as Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), the UNFCCC COP 27, Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) COP 15, the Comprehensive African Agricultural Development Programme (CAADP) framework and UN Food Systems Summit (2021). These frameworks and the National Position Paper on the Country's Food System Transformation Pathway Plan recognize agroecology as an approach to facilitate a transition towards more productive, sustainable and inclusive food systems through the harnessing of ecosystem services and natural processes in a productive manner.

Agroecology is an integrated approach that combines ecological principles with social justice to design and manage sustainable food systems. Agroecology emphasizes the optimization of interactions among plants, animals, humans, and the environment while minimizing overreliance on external inputs. This holistic framework not only addresses agricultural productivity but also aims to enhance food sovereignty and empower local communities, particularly marginalized groups such as women and indigenous peoples.

#### The following key aspects underlie Agroecology:

- A scientific discipline rooted in the application of ecological science to agricultural systems, studying interactions within agroecosystems to promote sustainability and resilience;
- Set of practices that mimic natural processes, fostering beneficial biological interactions and enhancing soil health through organic matter management; and,
- A social movement that advocates for food sovereignty, supporting smallholder farmers and promoting equitable food systems that respect local cultures and traditions;

#### Agroecology is guided by several principles that aim to transform food systems. Key among these -

- Co-creation of Knowledge by encouraging collaboration between farmers and scientists to share insights and innovations that support and develop food systems;
- Promoting crop and livestock diversity to enhance ecosystem resilience;
- Utilizing local renewable resources to reduce dependency on external inputs; and,
- Focusing on social equity within food systems, ensuring fair access to resources and decision-making processes.

The Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock Development in collaboration with other Ministries, Departments and State Agencies; County Governments and relevant non-State actors, have developed a **National Agroecology Strategy for Food System Transformation (NAS\_FST) 2024-2033**. The NAS\_FST, 2024 – 2033 is intended to augment Government efforts towards delivering food security and nutrition for all without compromising the economic, social and environmental underpinnings for future food security and nutrition. The overall goal of the NAS\_FST is to promote a sustainable transformation of the food system in Kenya to ensure food nutrition and security, climate resilient livelihoods and social inclusion for all. The Strategy employs a holistic agro-ecosystems and food systems approach; advocates for use of principles and practices that enhances the resilience and sustainability of food and farming systems while preserving social integrity; and, focuses on the practical application of agroecology to promote society sensitive and nature-positive agriculture, processing, distribution and consumption of food. The Strategy document was taken through extensive public participation during its development.

This notice is intended to notify the general public of the planned official unveiling of the NAS\_FST, 2024-2033 on **Thursday, 28<sup>th</sup> November 2024**. This will be accompanied by an exhibition of agroecology practices and technologies. **Those invited to attend will be expected to arrive and be seated at the launch venue by 8.00 am.**

Dkt Caesar Bitu, Mkuu wa Akiolojia Pwani katika Makavazi ya Kitaifa ya Kenya, anasema utajiri katika Bahari ya Hindi unaweza kuleta fedha nyingi za kigeni kupitia utalii wa kitamaduni wa chini ya maji.

Kwa bahati mbaya, kuna uhaba mkubwa wa wanaakiolojia wa chini ya maji Kenya, akasema.

Alitoa wito huu baada ya kutoa hotuba iliyopewa jina la “Gundua Maajabu ya Urithi wa Kitamaduni wa Chini ya Maji Kenya – Ajali ya Meli ya Ngomeni”

katika Jumba la Malindi Heritage, Kaunti ya Kilifi.

Hafla hiyo ilihudhuriwa na wakazi wa eneo hilo, wakiwemo vijana, wafanyakazi wa Makavazi ya Kitaifa ya Kenya, na wanachama wa Jumuiya ya Makavazi ya Malindi.

Walisimuliwa historia ya mpelelezi na baharia Vasco da Gama na meli alizotumia katika safari zake, ambazo baadhi yake zilizama katika maji ya Kenya.

Dkt. Bitu aliongoza timu ya wanaakiolojia na wapaiga mbizi chini ya maji katika kutafiti ajali ya meli ya Ureno inayoaminika kuzama kwenye ufuo wa Ngomeni mwaka wa 1524.

Katika msako wao, timu hiyo ilipata vitu mbalimbali vya kihistoria kutoka kwenye mabaki hayo.

“Akiolojia ya chini ya maji haina wataal-

amu wa kutosha nchini Kenya. Hivi tunavyozungumza, mimi ndiye pekee mwenye utaalam, ambao nilijifunza nje ya Kenya na ingawa nimefundisha vijana wanne hadi watano, hawatoshi,” Dkt Bitu alisema.

Alisisitiza haja ya elimu ya ndani katika taaluma hiyo kufanya mafunzo kupatikana kwa urahisi na kwa bei nafuu.

Waziri wa Afya Dkt Debora Barasa, alipotembelea Hospitali ya Rufaa ya Kapenguria, alisema kufikia sasa, serikali imetoa Sh5 bilioni, na Sh2.5 bilioni nyingine zinatarajiwa kutolewa wiki zijazo.

Waziri alisema kufikia mwisho wa Desemba 2024, vituo vyote vilivyo na kandarasi vitakuwa vimepokea malipo yake ya kwanza kupitia SHA.

Kupitia mpango huo, ambao ni sehemu ya Mpango Shirikishi wa Usimamizi wa Rasilimali za Maji (IWRMP), vyoo 550 vya kisasa vitajengwa Manyatta A ili kuboresha huduma za vyoo.

Mfumo wa majitaka katika eneo hilo pia utapanuliwa kwa kilomita 15 katika jitihada za kuzuia kuingia kwa majitaka katika Ziwa Victoria.

Kulingana na Mratibu wa Mpango, Arsene Aime Mukubwa, LVBC, wakala wa Jumuiya ya Afrika Mashariki (EAC) yenye jukumu la kuratibu maendeleo endelevu na usimamizi wa Eneo la Ziwa Victoria, imepokea Sh800 milioni ili kuanzisha mradi huo. Nyongeza ya Sh800 milioni, ambayo imejadiliwa, inatarajiwa kutolewa mwaka ujao.

Mukubwa alisema mpango huo ni sehemu ya mpango mkubwa wa Usimamizi wa Rasilimali za Maji katika Eneo la Ziwa Victoria, juhudi za kieneo zinazolenga kuboresha maji katika Ziwa Victoria, ambalo ni tegemeo kwa

“Mwaka jana, Wizara iliwezesha mkutano mkuu kati ya watayarishaji wa maziwa na Rais William Ruto ili kuanza mikakati ya malengo haya. Majadiliano hayo yalibainisha ajenda yenye vipengele sita, ikiwa ni pamoja na kuongeza pato la maziwa na kupunguza gharama za uzalishaji, kukuza uhifadhi na kupotea maziwa ghafi kwa ufanisi, kushughulikia vikwazo vya kodi vinavyozuia ukuaji wa sekta ya maziwa, kuanzisha hazina ya maendeleo ili kusaidia sekta hiyo, na kuimarisha ubora na usalama wa maziwa na bidhaa za maziwa,” akasema Waziri.

“Bodi ya Maziwa ya Kenya hivi majuzi ilianzisha maabara ya kitaifa ya udhibiti wa maziwa, ambayo sasa imeidhinishwa na ISO 17025, kuhakikisha majaribio ya kuaminika ya maziwa na bidhaa za maziwa. Wizara inalenga kuongeza uwezo wa maabara kwa ajili ya kupima uchafu na kuhimiza wadau kutumia

kituo hiki kupata masoko ya ndani na nje ya nchi,” CS alisema.

Ili kusaidia wakulima, Dkt Karanja alisema serikali inanunua vipozea vya ziada vya maziwa ili kuboresha uhifadhi wa maziwa kwa wingi, ubora na usalama huku ikihimiza mipango thabiti ya kilimo cha kandarasi.

Alisema juhudi pia zinaweza kuboresha upatikanaji wa makinikia

ya kibiashara ya bei nafuu, lishe bora na vinasaba bora.

Dkt Karanja alisema sekta ya maziwa ni sekta muhimu ya kijamii na kiuchumi nchini Kenya katika kusaidia mapato, ajira, usalama wa chakula, na hali ya kijamii kwa wengi.

Kila mwaka, Kenya huzalisha takriban lita bilioni 5.2 za maziwa, ikiwa ni pamoja na asilimia 10 ya Afrika na asilimia 35 ya jumla ya uzalishaji wa Jumuiya ya Afrika Mashariki.

Waziri alielezea kuwa mwaka wa 2023, maziwa yaliyopokewa na soko rasmi yalipanda kwa asilimia 7.4 hadi kilo milioni 811, kutoka kilo milioni 755 mwaka wa 2022.

Thamani ya maziwa hayo iliongezeka kwa asilimia 13, na kufikia Sh40.5 bilioni, ikilinganishwa na Sh35.7 bilioni mwaka uliotangulia.

Dkt. Karanja alisema kulingana na Utafiti

wa Kiuchumi wa 2024, maziwa yanaorodheshwa kama bidhaa ya nne ya kilimo yenye thamani kubwa nchini Kenya baada ya chai, kilimo cha bustani na mauzo ya ng'ombe, kusaidia maisha ya wafugaji wadogo wa maziwa wa vijijini zaidi ya milioni mbili.

Waziri alieleza kuwa utafiti wa hivi majuzi kuhusu gharama ya uzalishaji wa maziwa unathibitisha kuwa ufugaji wa ng'ombe wa maziwa bado una faida, na mapato ya kati ya Sh9.8 hadi Sh13.9 kwa lita, kulingana na mfumo wa uzalishaji.

“Licha ya changamoto kama vile gharama kubwa za malisho ya biashara, malisho ya mifugo na vibarua, faida inaangazia ufugaji wa ng'ombe kama uwekezaji mzuri,” Dkt. Karanja alisema.

Alitoa wito kwa wadau, wakiwemo wakulima, vyama vya ushirika, wasindikaji na

wawekezaji binafsi kuchangamkia mpango wa Serikali wa kukodisha ardhi ya umma kwa ajili ya uzalishaji mkubwa na usambazaji wa malisho bora akisema kuwa kuboresha kwa mikakati ya ulishaji kutaongeza tija kwa kiasi kikubwa.

“Kwa hakika, wastani wa uzalishaji wa maziwa kwa ng'ombe mmoja umeongezeka kutoka lita 7.9 mwaka 2020 hadi kilo 9.3 mwaka 2023. Ingawa bado kuna njia ndefu kufikia viwango vya kimataifa kama vile lita 40 za Israeli kwa ng'ombe kwa siku, juhudi endelevu na mikakati madhubuti inaweza kuleta maendeleo makubwa,” alisema.

Dkt Karanja alishukuru jitihada za sekta hiyo kudumisha bei ya juu ya wazalishaji, ambayo ni wastani wa Sh46 kwa lita katika mwaka uliopita akisema kwamba hii iko chini ya Sh50 iliyopendekezwa na Serikali kwa lita.

Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa KDB Margaret Kibogy alisema kumekuwa na ongezeko la wakulima wanaouza maziwa yao kwenye vyama vya ushirika ili kuhakikisha fedha nyingi zinakwenda kwa wakulima.

Kibogy alisema idadi ya vyama vya ushirika imeongezeka kutoka 600 hadi sasa karibu 700 nchi nzima jambo linalomaanisha wakulima wanajipanga zaidi na hii itasaidia kuimarika kwa ubora.

“Kuongezeka kwa uzalishaji wa maziwa bora kutatuwezesha kutekeleza mifumo ya malipo inayozingatia ubora kwani tutaweza kufuatilia na kufuatilia ubora na usalama wa maziwa kupitia maabara yetu,” akasema Kibogy.



## Kuondolewa kwa marufuku ya GMO kukata bei ya lishe, kuongeza maziwa

**K**uondolewa kwa marufuku ya Viumbe Vilivyobadilishwa Kinasaba (GMOs) na bidhaa zinazotokana na zao kutapunguza gharama ya vyakula vya mifugo nchini na hivyo kupunguza gharama za uzalishaji wa maziwa, Mamlaka ya Kitaifa ya Usalama wa Mazingira (NBA) imesema.

Waziri wa Kilimo Dkt Andrew Karanja alisisitiza haja ya kuimarisha ufuatiliaji na utekelezaji wa ubora wa malisho na malighafi sokoni.

Alisema hayo alipokuwa akitoa Ripoti ya Gharama ya Uzalishaji wa Maziwa ya Bodi ya Maziwa ya Kenya ya 2024 jijini Nairobi.

Akizungumzia suala hilo, Kaimu Afisa Mkuu Mtendaji Mkuu wa NBA, Nehemiah Ngetich, alithibitisha kuwa mamlaka hiyo iko tayari kupokea na kushughulikia maombi ya kutolewa kwa mazingira na uwekaji soko wa bidhaa za GMO, kwa kushirikiana na mashirika mengine ya udhibiti.

Ngetich alisema utafiti kuhusu GMO utaendelea, kwani kipengele hiki hakijaathiriwa na marufuku iliyowekwa awali, ambayo



sasa imeondolewa.

“Maombi ya uingizaji na usafirishaji wa GMO yanaweza kushughulikiwa na Mamlaka. Maombi yote yatashughulikiwa kwa mujibu wa masharti ya Sheria ya Usalama wa Viumbe na Kanuni za Usalama wa Viumbe,” Akasema Ngetich.

Alieleza kuwa Sheria ya Usalama wa Viumbe hai inahitaji kibali kuwekwa sokoni na kibali kingine cha kuagiza kutoka nje kwani wafanyabiashara wanatakiwa kupata kibali cha maandishi kutoka kwa Mamlaka kabla ya kuagiza viumbe vilivyobadilishwa kinasaba.

Waagizaji bidhaa, kulingana na Ngetich, wana-

takiwa kujisajili na Mamlaka ya Kitaifa ya Usalama wa Viumbe kwa njia iliyowekwa kwa kujaza na kutuma maombi ya mtandaoni ya kuwekwa kwenye soko la GMO na bidhaa husika.

“Ikiidhinishwa, kibali cha kuwekwa sokoni ni cha muda usiozidi miaka 10 kwa bidhaa hiyo hiyo na ni ya mwombaji pekee. Ikikataliwa, mwombaji atafahamishwa sababu,” akaooneza Ngetich.

Alihakikishia umma kwamba Kenya ina mfumo wa udhibiti, ambao hutoa mchakato uliorahisishwa kwa kampuni na mashirika yanayotaka kuagiza GMOs na bidhaa zao zinazotokana na kueleza mahitaji ma-

hususi ya maombi, tathmini za usalama, na hatua za ufuatiliaji.

“Utaratibu huu unalingana na kujitolea kwa Kenya kwa usalama wa chakula, ulinzi wa mazingira na ustawi wa kiuchumi wa raia wake,” alisisitiza.

Kenya imetia sainsi Itifaki ya Cartagena kuhusu Usalama wa Viumbe baada ya kuiridhia 2003, Sheria ya Usalama wa Mazingira ya 2009 na Mamlaka ya Kitaifa ya Usalama wa Viumbe. Itifaki hiyo ni sehemu ya mkataba wa kimataifa unaotoa mfumo wa matumizi ya teknolojia huku pia ukitambua hatari zinazoweza kusababishwa na teknolojia mpya.

### Wizara yazingati mafunzo kwa wauguzi na wakunga katika kuboresha SHA

Wizara ya Afya imejitolea kuwekeza katika kukuza taaluma ya wauguzi na wakunga, huku ikipanga kuweka muuguzi kwa kila kata kuwa bingwa ili kufanikisha mpango wa Mamlaka ya Afya ya Jamii (SHA).

Waziri wa Afya Dkt. Deborah Barasa alisisitiza kuwa wauguzi wanapoongoza mradi, wanahakikisha unafanikiwa. Hii ndiyo sababu wizara inatanguliza maeindeleo yao ya kitaaluma, si tu katika ujuzi wa kimatibabu bali pia katika uongozi, fikra makini na usuluhishaji matatizo.

Akizungumza katika Warsha ya Maafisa Wakuu wa Wauguzi wa Kaunti jijini Nairobi, Dkt Barasa alithibitisha kujitolea kwa Wizara kusaidia mipango ambayo itaimarisha uwezo Wauguzi. “Kama wauguzi na wakunga, tunahitaji kuhirikiana kikamilifu na watunga sera, na wadau wengine ili kuhakikisha sauti zetu zinasikika katika ngazi zote,” akasema.

Waziri alisema katika hali ya kisasa ya huduma ya afya inayobadilika kwa kasi, kukumbatia mbinu bunifu za utoaji huduma za afya ni muhimu.

Aliongeza kuwa wauguzi lazima waongoze katika kukabiliana na changamoto mpya, kutoka kwa kutumia suluhu za afya za kidijitali hadi kukumbatia itifaki mpya za matibabu.

“Nimeambiwa mna-taka kuboresha ukusanyaji wa data zenu kupitia mfumo wa kiteknolojia wa AI kwa wauguzi na wakunga na mtatumia mfumo huu wa kiteknolojia katika warsha hii. Hii inanipa heshima kubwa kwa wauguzi na wakunga. Pia inanipa matumaini makubwa ya kufaulu katika kufanikisha SHA,” akasema.

Kumekuwa na kilio kutoka kwa wagonjwa wakidai walirudishwa bila matibabu. Naibu Gavana alihusisha hili na ukosefu wa taarifa kuhusu vifurushi na kandarasi za SHA.

Akizungumza wakati wa ziara ya kituo hicho, Naibu Gavana aliongeza kuwa watanunua vifaa vya kuwawezesha kutoa huduma bora na kushughulikia hali tata za wagonjwa wa nje.

Afisa Mtendaji Mkuu wa kituo hicho, Bancy Wawira alisema tayari tathmini imefanyika kwa kitengo kipya cha ngazi ya pili na ilikuwa ikisubiri kusajiliwa.
