Magavana wa kaunti za Nyeri, Nyandarua, Kirinyaga na Murang'a wametangaza msamaha

wa ada ya leseni ya biashara kwa mwaka mzima kwa wanufaika wa mpango wa National Youth Opportunities Towards Advancement (NYOTA). Mbali na msamaha huo, kaunti hizo zitotoa mafunzo ya usaidizi

izi wa biashara na mipango ya kujenga uwezo ili kuhakikisha vijana wameandaliwa vyema kuendesha biashara zao. Hatua hiyo inalenga kupunguza gharama za kufanya biashara, hivyo kuruhusu fedha zaidi

kuelekezwa katika ununuzi wa bidhaa na kuboresha kiwango cha uendeleu wa biashara zinazoongozwa na vijana. Gavana wa Kaunti ya Nyeri, Dkt. Mutahi Kahiga, alieleza kuwa ki-paumbele cha kwanza cha kaunti hizo ni kuwapatia vijana nafasi ya kuendesha biashara zao, kisha kufuta ada za leseni za biashara kwa mwaka mmoja ili kuwasaidia "kuanza kazi mara moja." Gavana wa Kaunti ya Nyandarua, Dkt. Kiarie Badilisha, alisisitiza kuwa kaunti itasaidia wajasiriamali kutambua na kufikia masoko ya bidhaa zao. Aliwahimiza vijana kuzingatia kaulimbiu ya Nunua Nyandarua, Jenga Nyandarua, akiahidi kuwa kaunti itakuwa mteja wa kwanza kusaidia biashara za ndani. Tangazo hilo lilitolewa katika uwanja wa maonyesho wa Kabiru-ini mjini Nyeri wakati wa kongamano la utoaji wa mtaji wa kuanzisha biashara chini ya mpango wa NYOTA, lililoongozwa na Rais William Ruto. Katika hafla hiyo, takribani vijana 6,000 kutoka kaunti hizo nne walipokea Sh22,000 kati ya jumla ya Sh50,000 ya mtaji wa kuanzisha biashara. Aidha, Sh3,000

ziliwekwa katika akaunti zao za akiba za Mfuko wa Kitaifa wa Hifadhi ya Jamii (NSSF). Mpango wa NYOTA ni mpango mkuu wa kuwawezesha vijana unaofadhiliwa kwa pamoja na serikali na Benki ya Dunia. Mpango huo wa miaka mitano una thamani ya Sh5 bilioni na unalenga kuwafikia vijana 820,000 walio katika mazingira magumu na wasio na ajira kutoka kata 1,450 kote nchini. Waombaji wanaostahili ni wenye umri wa miaka 18 hadi 29, huku kikomo cha umri kikiongezwa hadi miaka 35 kwa watu wenye ulemavu. Mpango huo umejengwa juu ya nguzo kuu tatu. Nguzo ya kwanza, Uzoefu Kazini (On-the-Job Experience), itawaweka vijana 90,000 kwa waajiri na mafundi ili kupata uzoefu wa kazi huku wakipokea posho ya Sh6,000 kwa mwezi kwa kipindi cha miezi sita. Sehemu ya pili, Utambuzi wa Ujuzi Uliopatikana Awali (Recognition of Prior Learning), itawawezesha vijana 20,000 kupata utambuzi rasmi wa ujuzi walioupata kupitia mafunzo yasiyo rasmi. Aidha, vijana 600,000 watafunzwa kuhusu jinsi ya kushiriki katika fursa za ununuzi wa serikali. Nguzo ya tatu, Usaidizi wa Biashara, inalenga kutoa hadi Sh50,000 kama mtaji wa kuanzisha biashara kwa vijana 100,000 ili waanzishe biashara zao. Mpango huo pia unasisitiza

Nataka kuwahakikishia walengwa mashirika yote ya utekelezaji ya NYOTA yamejitolea kuona vijana wanunafaika kikamilifu.

Serikali, kupitia Mam-laka ya Kitaifa ya Usimamizi wa Ukame (NDMA), imetoa Shilingi milioni 870.38 kwa kaya 132,780 zilizohatarini chini ya Mpango wa Hunger Safety Net Programme (HSNP) katika kaunti nane za ukame, kama sehemu ya juhudi zinazoendelea za kulinda jamii zilizohatarini dhidi ya athari za ukame unaoendelea. Malipo hayo yanalenga kaya katika kaunti za Mandera, Marsabit, Wajir, Turkana, Samburu, Isiolo, Garissa na Tana River, ambazo zinaendelea kukabiliwa na hali mbaya ya usalama wa chakula kutokana na misimu mfululizo ya mvua chini ya wastani. Kwa kuimarisha uwezo wa kaya kununua mahitaji, ru-zuku hizi za fedha zinatarajiwa kupunguza mikakati hasi ya kukabiliana na hali ngumu, kuimarisha ulaji wa chakula, na kulinda vyanzo vya msingi vya maisha katika kipindi hiki cha ukame. Ukame unaoendelea umeathiri pakubwa usalama wa chakula wa kaya katika kaunti za ukame na nusu-ukame. Malipo haya

ya fedha ni sehemu muhimu ya hatua za awali za Serikali katika kukabiliana na ukame, yakisaidia kaya zilizothirika kukidhi mahitaji ya haraka ya chakula na bidhaa muhimu huku Serikali ikiimarisha hatua pana zaidi za kukabiliana na ukame kwa ushirikiano na washirika wa kibinadamu na maendeleo. Akizungumza wakati wa ziara katika kituo cha malipo katika Wadi ya Afwein, Kaunti ya Garissa, ambapo alishuhudia uga-waji unaoendelea wa malipo, Afisa Mkuu Mtendaji wa NDMA,

Luteni Kanali (Mst.) Hared Adan, alieleza kuwa ruzuku hizi za fedha ni mkombozi muhimu kwa kaya zilizothirika na ukame. Alibainisha kuwa kadri hali ya ukame inavyoendelea katika kaunti za ukame na nusu-ukame, Serikali inaweka kipaumbele ulinzi wa kijamii sambamba na hatua nyingine za kukabiliana na ukame ili kuzuia kuzorota zaidi kwa usalama wa chakula na lishe miongoni mwa makundi yaliyo hatarini. “Malipo haya yanaakisi dhamira ya Serikali ya kuwalinda raia

walio hatarini zaidi dhidi ya athari za ukame. Ruzuku za fedha chini ya Mpango wa Hunger Safety Net Programme zinawezesha kaya kukidhi mahitaji ya haraka ya chakula na ya msingi huku zikilinda utu na riziki zao,” alisema Adan. Katika awamu hii ya sasa ya malipo, kaya 9,222 za wanufaika katika Kaunti ya Garissa zimepokea jumla ya Shilingi 49,798,800, zikitoa afueni inayohitajika sana wakati ambapo uwezo wa kununua wa kaya umeporomoka kwa kiasi kikubwa kutokana na misimu mfululizo ya mvua duni. Mbali na wanufaika wa moja kwa moja, ruzuku hizi za fedha pia zinaleta manufaa chanya kwa uchumi wa maeneo husika. Katika Kituo cha Afwein, mfi-yabiashara Abdi Billow alisema mpango huu unasaidia kuendelea biashara ndogo ndogo huku ukipunguza mzigo kwa kaya zinazokumbwa na hali ngumu. “Wanufaika wengi hukusanya fedha zao na mara moja hununua chakula na bidhaa muhimu kama vile mchele, sukari, maziwa ya unga na sabuni. Wengine wanaweza kulipa madeni yaliyokusanywa madukani, jambo linalorejesha uaminifu wao wa kibiashara na kuwawezesha kuendelea kupata chakula kwa mkopo,” alisema Billow.

Kundi la pili la vijana 5,901 kutoka eneo la Lower Eastern—kaunti za Machakos, Makueni na Kitui—limepokea awamu ya kwanza ya mtaji wa kuanzisha biashara wa Sh22,000 chini ya mpango wa National Youth Opportunities Towards Advancement (NYOTA). Fedha hizo zinalenga kuwasaidia kuanzisha biashara na kujikwamua kiuchumi. Rais William Ruto, aliyesimamia ugawaji wa fedha hizo katika Uwanja wa Kenyatta mjini Machakos, alisema jumla ya Shilingi milioni 147.5 zimetolewa kwa

kaunti za Machakos, Makueni na Kitui, zikilenga vijana 70 hadi 80 kutoka kila wadi. Alithibitisha kuwa mchakato wa kuchagua wanufaika wa NYOTA ulikuwa wa uwazi na haki, bila rushwa wala madalali, na akaahidi kuchukua hatua kali dhidi ya yeyote atakayejihusisha na vitendo vya kuwatoza vijana fedha kinyume cha sheria, akisisitiza kuwa washiriki wote wanaostahili watapewa fursa sawa. “Mpango huu hauhitaji mtu kumjua kiongozi au mtu mashuhuri yeyote ili kufuzu kupata fedha za NYOTA. Umeundwa kukuza Ajenda ya Mageuzi ya Kiuchumi ya



Wafaidika 5,901 wa NYOTA kutoka kaunti za Machakos, Makueni na Kitui baada ya kupokea kila mtaji wa Sh22,000 katika uwanja wa Kenyatta mjini Machakos kama sehemu ya malipo yao ya kwanza ya kuanzisha biashara na kujiwezesha.

Kuanzia Chini (BETA), kwa kuwawezesha vijana kupitia mafunzo na ushauri elekezi huku ukilenga wale walioko mashinani,” alisema Rais. Aliongeza kuwa, kama sehemu ya mapambano dhidi ya ufisadi, serikali imefanya huduma 23,000 kuwa za kidijitali ili ziweze kupatikana kwa urahisi na wananchi bila vikwazo au madalali. “Si kila mtu ana uwezo sawa; wengine hawana elimu, na ni lazima tuwape wote nafasi.

Hiyo ndiyo maana halisi ya BETA,” aliongeza Rais. Naibu Rais Kithure Kindiki alisema fedha zilizotolewa zinalenga biashara ndogo ndogo na kuinua maisha ya wale wenye elimu ndogo au wasio na elimu kabisa, akieleza kuwa huo ndio ufafanuzi halisi wa BETA inayolenga kuifanya Kenya kuwa uchumi wa dunia ya kwanza. Aliongeza kuwa wanaopinga wakidai fedha hizo ni kidogo wanapaswa

kuelewa kuwa si mkopo, na kiasi hicho kinatosha kuwawezesha vijana kuanza ujasiriamali. “Tunaandaa ajira na fursa kwa vijana wa Kenya ili watusaidie kwa rasilimali watu itakayobadilisha taifa letu kupitia uchumi unaoongozwa na maarifa na ujasiriamali,” aliongeza Naibu Rais. Waziri wa Ushirika na Biashara Ndogo, Ndogo na za Kati (MSMEs), Wycliffe Oparanya, aliwahimiza vijana kutumia vyema fedha hizo za biashara ili kuanzisha miradi imara itakayozalisha faida na kubadilisha maisha yao. Katibu Mkuu wa Wizara ya MSMEs, Susan Mangeni, aliwaarifu wanufaika kuwa kutakuwa na programu ya mafunzo na ushauri elekezi ya mwezi mmoja ili kuwasaidia kuelewa vyema uendeshaji wa biashara, akiongeza kuwa serikali itaendelea kuwaunga mkono endapo watakumbana na changamoto. “Tutakuja kuona mlipofikia katika biashara zenu, na tutakuwa hapo kuwaunga mkono kwa sababu safari mliyoanza inalenga kuhakikisha mnakuwa mamilionea na wenye viwanda wa taifa hili,” alitangaza PS Mangeni.

Maafisa wa Chuo Kikuu cha Kisii, wawakilishi wa Idara ya Makazi na wakandarasi wakionyesha bango la mradi wakati wa makabidhiano rasmi ya eneo kwa ajili ya kijiji cha wanafunzi kinachofadhiliwa na serikali chini ya Mpango wa Nyumba za Gharama Nafuu, kutoa malazi ya kisasa katika taasisi hiyo.

KChuo Kikuu cha Kisii kimekabi-dhi rasmi eneo la ujenzi wa kijiji cha kisasa cha wanafunzi chini ya Mpango wa Kitaifa wa Nyumba Nafuu. Mradi huo unatarajiwa kupunguza kwa kiasi kikubwa uhaba wa muda mrefu wa malazi chuoni humo na kuboresha kwa ujumla ubora wa maisha ya wanafunzi. Serikali yazindua mradi wa nishati ya jua wa Sh670m kupunguza gharama ya maji

Serikali imezindua mradi wa umeme wa jua wenye thamani ya Sh670 milioni katika Kituo cha Maji cha Baricho, Kaunti ya Kilifi, katika juhudi kubwa za kupunguza gharama kubwa ya kupumpa maji kwa Kaunti za Kilifi na Mombasa. Mradi wa Baricho Solar Water

Project wenye thamani ya mamilioni ya shilingi unatekelezwa na Wakala wa Maendeleo ya Maji ya Pwani (CWWDA), ukiungwa mkono kifizha na Benki ya Dunia kupitia Mradi wa Maendeleo ya Maji na Usafi wa Mazingira (WSDP). Baada ya kukamilika, mradi unatarajiwa kupunguza kwa kiasi kikubwa bili za umeme—

ambazo kwa sasa zinatofautiana kati ya Sh60 milioni na Sh70 milioni kwa mwezi—kuboresha uhakika wa upatikanaji wa maji, kupunguza gharama za uendesaji kwa muda mrefu, na kuimarisha usalama wa maji kwa mamia ya melfu ya wakazi wa Pwani ya Kenya. Mradi unatarajiwa kukamilika Machi 2026. Akizungumza wakati wa ukaguzi

wa mradi, Mratibu wa Mradi wa CWWDA, Mhandisi David Kanui, alisema kuwa wakala huo umekuwa ukikabiliana na changamoto ya gharama kubwa za umeme kutokana na utegemezi mkubwa wa umeme wa gridi kupumpa maji kutoka visima na kuyapandisha kwa umbali mrefu hadi kwa watumiaji. “Gharama za umeme zimekuwa changamoto kubwa kwakituohiki. Maji hupumpwa kutoka visima kisha kupandishwa tena hadi kwa watumiaji Kilifi na Mombasa, na mchakato huo unatumia umeme mwingi,” Kanui alisema. Kiwanda cha umeme wa jua cha megawati 4.6 kitapasha visima 11 na mfumo wa pampu za mwinuko wa juu zinazotoa maji Malindi chini ya awamu ya kwanza ya mradi. Baada ya Awamu ya Kwanza kuanza kufanya kazi kikamilifu, wakala unatarajia kupunguza bili yake ya umeme ya kila mwezi kwa takriban Sh10 milioni. Akiba hii inatarajiwa kupunguza gharama za uendesaji kwa watoa huduma za maji na hatimaye kunufaisha watumiaji. “Wakati awamu hii itakamilika, gharama ya umeme itapungua, na akiba hiyo itatafsiriwa katika kupunguza gharama za uendesaji kwa kampuni za maji,” Kanui alisema. Mradi umeundwa kama mfumo

mchanganyiko unaunganisha nishati ya jua na umeme wa gridi. Shughuli za pampu zitaeendeshwa kwa kutumia nishati ya jua mchana, huku umeme wa gridi ukitumika usiku na wakati wa mwanga mdogo wa jua. “Tutatumia umeme wa jua kwa takriban saa nane mchana na umeme wa gridi kwa masaa yaliyobaki. 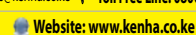
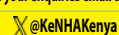

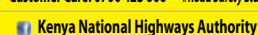

fundi maabara, kujenga makazi ya wafanyakazi na kulipa mishahara ya wafanyakazi wa msaada kwa zaidi ya miaka mitano. “Hili ni afueni kwa kina mama kwa sababu wataweza kufikia huduma hizi kwa urahisi. Pia ni mwanzo mzuri wa mwaka kwa kutoa huduma

Wanachama wa jamii ya Ogiek katika Kaunti ya Nandi wameongeza wito kwa Serikali ya Kitaifa kuharakisha mchakato wa kuwahamisha na kuwapeleka katika ardhi yao ya asili ya Misitu ya Serengeti na Kosobei. Kwa umuhimu mkubwa, Mpango huo mpya unaolenga gharama nafuu na matokeo umebuniwa kuendesha juhudi za kufikia malengo ya kimataifa ya 90–70–90: kuchanja asilimia 90 ya wasichana dhidi ya virusi vya HPV, kuwachunguza asilimia 70 ya wanawake, na kuhakikisha asilimia 90 ya waliogundulika na ugonjwa wanapata matibabu kwa wakati. Aidha, mpango huo unatangukiza chanjo ya HPV, uchunguzi wa mapema na kwa usawa, matibabu ya haraka pamoja na ufuatiliaji wa muda mrefu, sambamba na mkakati wa Shirika la Afya Duniani (WHO) wa kuondoa saratani ya mlango wa kizazi kama tishio kwa afya ya umma. Katika hotuba yake kuu, Waziri Duale alibainisha mageuzi muhimu ya sera na programu, yakiwemo mpito wa Kenya kwenda ratiba ya chanjo ya HPV ya dozi moja, upanuzi wa upimaji wa HPV DNA, kuanzishwa kwa uchukuaaji sampuli binafsi ili kuongeza idadi

ya wanawake wanaofanyiwa uchunguzi, pamoja na matumizi ya ubunifu wa afya kidijitali ili kupanua huduma kwa wanawake katika kaunti zote 47. Alisisitiza pia uwekezaji unaoendelea wa Serikali katika kuimarisha mifumo ya rufaa, kupanua miundombinu ya matibabu ya saratani, kujenga rasilimali watu wenye ujuzi katika sekta ya afya, na kuendeleza mageuzi ya ufadhili wa afya chini ya Mamlaka ya Afya ya Jamii, kwa lengo la kufanya huduma za saratani zipatikane kwa urahisi, ziwe nafuu na zenye usawa. Vilevile, Waziri alitangaza utekelezaji wa hati za huduma za lazima katika vituo vyote vya afya vya umma na binafsi, zita-kazoonyesha wazi huduma zinazoungwa mkono na serikali, hatua inayolenga kuimarisha uwazi, kudhibiti utozaji usiofaa na kulinda haki za wagonjwa. Sayansi na ubunifu ni viungo muhimu vya kufanikisha afya bora, ambayo ni lengo la pamoja la kitaifa. Wakati wa ziara yangu ya mafunzo na kujitambulisha katika Taasisi ya Utafiti wa Tiba nchini Kenya (KEMRI), taasisi ya kitaifa inayoongoza katika masuala ya afya na kituo cha umahiri barani Afrika, nilishuhudia moja kwa moja dhamira ya kudumu ya nchi katika kuendeleza utafiti wa afya ya binadamu. KEMRI ilianzishwa mwaka 1979 chini ya Sheria ya Sayansi na Teknolojia (iliyofutwa) Sura ya 250 ya Sheria za Kenya, ikiwa na idadi ndogo tu ya wanasayansi, na tangu wakati huo imekua na kuwa nguzo kuu ya kikanda ikiwa na zaidi ya watafiti 450. Uwepo uliopangwa na wenye madhumuni wa Mkurugenzi Mkuu, Mwenyekiti na wajumbe wa Bodi ya Usimamizi ya KEMRI, wanasayansi mashuhuri, watafiti na washirika wa maendeleo

ulithibitisha tena wajibu wa Idara ya Serikali katika kusimamia sera na programu za sayansi, utafiti na ubunifu. Pia unaangazia juhudi za kuanzisha mfumo jumuishi wa ushirikiano kati ya taasisi za utafiti, vyo vikuu na sekta ya viwanda, huku KEMRI ikiwa mojawapo ya taasisi kinara. Rais Ruto ameipa Sayansi, Utafiti na Ubunifu kipaumbele cha juu kitaifa. Kuanzishwa kwa Idara hii ya Serikali ni ishara ya dhamira yake ya suluhisho zinazotokana na utafiti. Kuongeza Mfuko wa Kitaifa wa Utafiti kutoka asilimia 0.8 hadi asilimia 2 ya Pato la Taifa (GDP), ambacho kinaweza kufikia shilingi trilion 1 ndani ya muongo mmoja, ni jambo la lazima. Tayari tunaandaa Mpango Kabambe wa Miaka 10 wa Ufadhili na Uimarishaji wa Uwezo wa Utafiti nchini Kenya (2026–2036), ambao tunatarajia utaweka mfumo endelevu wa uwekezaji unaohitajika kwa dharura katika sekta hii. Kwa sasa, bajeti ya kitaifa ya afya imeongezeka kutoka shilingi bilioni 193 hadi takribani shilingi bilioni 232, ikionyesha dhamira yetu ya kufanikisha Huduma ya Afya kwa Wote. Uwezo wa Kenya katika utafiti umeendelea sambamba, huku KEMRI ikiorodheshwa kama taasisi bora zaidi ya utafiti wa afya barani Afrika, ikichangia mafanikio ya kimataifa katika afya, yakiwemo maendeleo ya chanjo ya malaria. Katika kipindi cha miaka saba iliyopita, Mfuko wa Kitaifa wa Utafiti (NRF) umefadhili utafiti wa afya kwa bajeti ya shilingi

milioni 700. Zaidi ya shilingi milioni 170 kati ya fedha hizo zimeelekezwa KEMRI kusaidia miradi katika nyanja mbalimbali za utafiti wa afya. NACOSTI imesajili taasisi kadhaa za utafiti zinazohusiana na afya, zikiwemo KEMRI, na pia imeshirikiana na KEMRI katika kujenga uwezo kuhusu Maadili ya Utafiti. Wakati wa janga la COVID-19, KeNIA ilichukua jukumu muhimu katika kuidhinisha na kutoa ithubati kwa bunifu nyingi za afya zilizoiibuka. Muunganiko wa afya, sayansi, utafiti na ubunifu si dhana ya kitaaluma tu. Ni hitaji la msingi kwa mustakabali wa taifa letu. Majukumu ya KEMRI ni ya msingi katika kuimarisha mfumo imara wa afya, yakeitekelezwa kupitia nguzo nne muhimu, zikiwemo Ufuatiliaji na Udhidhi wa Magonjwa—mfumo wa tahadhari ya mapema wa Kenya dhidi ya magonjwa kuanzia malaria hadi COVID-19. Ubunifu wa Bidhaa za Afya unalenga kuendeleza vifaa vya uchunguzi na teknolojia; ambao ni msingi wa mfumo wetu wa ndani wa ubunifu wa afya. Sera Zinazoongozwa na Ushahidi hutafsi matokeo ya utafiti kuwa maamuzi ya kuokoa maisha, kama vile kusitishwa kwa matumizi ya dawa zisizo na ufanisi za malaria. Hata hivyo, changamoto kubwa inaendelea kuwepo: “bonde la kifo” kati ya utafiti na maendeleo (R&D) na uuzaji wa kibiashara. Bunifu nyingi hubaki maabara, zikikwamishwa na uhaba wa mtaji wa uwekezaji

na ushiriki mdogo wa sekta binafsi. Kuvuka pengo hili ni kipaumbele cha kimkakati. Tunapambana na mzigo unaongezeka wa magonjwa mawili kwa wakati mmoja: magonjwa ya kuambukiza yanayoendelea, pamoja na ongezeko la haraka la magonjwa yasiyoambukiza (NCDs) kama saratani, kisukari na magonjwa ya moyo. Mabadiliko ya tabianchi, usugu wa vimelea dhidi ya dawa, vimelea vipya na ukuaji wa miji vinabadilisha kwa kasi usalama wa afya. Katika hali hii changamano, sayansi, utafiti na ubunifu si hiari tena bali ni misingi ya lazima. Taasisi kama KEMRI si vituo vya utafiti tu; ni rasilimali za kimkakati za taifa. Ili kubadilisha mazingira ya afya nchini, ni lazima tuchukue hatua katika vipaumbele saba vilivyunganishwa: Kuwekeza katika Utafiti Unaolenga Dhamira Mahususi, unaolenga maeneo yenye mzigo mkubwa wa magonjwa, tiba mahususi, jenomiki, maendeleo ya chanjo, afya ya kidijitali na mwingiliano kati ya tabianchi na afya. Kuimarisha Mnyororo wa Utafiti hadi Sera kwa kuasisi mifumo ya kutafsi ushahidi kupitia taarifa za kitaalamu, vikundi vya kazi vya pamoja na njia za utekelezaji wa haraka. Kuharakisha Ubiashara wa Bunifu kwa kuimarisha ushirikiano na viwanda, kuimarisha mifumo ya haki miliki (IP), na kuunga mkono Kituo cha Bayoteknolojia cha KEMRI ili kusogeza bidhaa kutoka

maabara hadi sokoni. Kujenga Uwezo wa Utafiti wa Karne ya 21 kwa kupanua Shule ya Wahitimu ya KEMRI, kutoa ufadhili wa ushindani na kuunda njia bora za ajira ili kuhifadhi vipaji. Kuimarisha Mbinu za Mashirika Mbalimbali ili kusaidia utafiti na shughuli muhimu wakati ushindani wa kupata fedha za utafiti unaongezeka. Njia iliyo mbele yetu ina changamoto, lakini si ya kushindikana. Inahitaji dhamira thabiti kwa ushahidi, uwekezaji endelevu katika utafiti na rasilimali watu, ujasiri wa kibiashara kwa manufaa ya umma, na ushirikiano unaovunja vikwazo.

Viwanda vya sukari vilivyokwama vyanza shughuli, vyafaa wakulima

Sekta ya sukari imeonyesha maendeleo makubwa baada ya viwanda vinne vilivyokuwa havifanyi kazi kuanza upya operesheni zake miezi sita tu baada ya kukodishwa, katika jitihada za kuimarisha sekta hiyo. Katibu wa Kilimo, Paul Ronoh, alisema kwamba viwanda vya sukari vya Chemelil, Sony, Nzoia, na Muhoroni vyote vimeanza kukandaa miwa. Alibainisha kuwa maendeleo haya ni hatua muhimu katika juhudi za serikali za kuhuisha sekta iliyokuwa imedhoofishwa na usimamizi mbaya, deni linaloongezeka, na ucheleweshaji wa malipo kwa wakulima kwa muda mrefu. Dkt. Ronoh alitoa kauli hizi wakati akitembelea Kiwanda cha Sukari cha Chemelil, akielezea maendeleo hayo kama msaada mkubwa kwa wakulima na uchumi kwa ujumla. “Kuanzishwa upya kwa Chemelil na viwanda vingine kunathibitisha kuwa mpango wa serikali wa kuhuisha sekta ya sukari unanza kuchipuka,” alisema, akibainisha umuhimu wa sekta hiyo katika kusaidia maisha ya vijijini na kuendeleza ukuaji wa uchumi. Kiwanda cha Chemelil, sasa

kikiwa chini ya usimamizi wa Chatthe Group, kinafanya kazi kwa takribani nusu ya uwezo wake wa uzalishaji, na mpango wa kuongeza hadi uzalishaji kamili wa takribani tani 3,500 za miwa kwa siku. Kulingana na Katibu, kuanza upya kwa kukandaa miwa kumeleta faida halisi kwa wakulima, hasa kupitia malipo bora na yanayoweza kutabirika. “Wakulima sasa wanapewa malipo kila siku saba na wanapata hadi Sh5,750

kwa tani, kiwango cha juu zaidi waliyowahi kupokea,” alisema, akiongeza kuwa hii ni mabadiliko kutoka enzi zilizopita ambapo malipo yangechelewa kwa miezi. Serikali pia imewaagiza wafanyabiashara wote wa viwanda vya sukari kuandaa mpango wa miaka mitano unaolenga kuweka Kenya katika nafasi ya kukidhi mahitaji yake ya sukari na kupunguza utegemezi wa uingizaji wa nje. Alitambua kwamba upungufu wa miwa bado ni kik-

wazo kikubwa kwa uzalishaji endelevu. Ili kufanikisha hili, Taasisi ya Utafiti wa Sukari Kenya (Kenya Sugar Research Institute) imepewa jukumu la kuanzisha aina 27 za miwa zilizoboreshwa ambazo zinakua haraka, kutoa mazao zaidi na kustahimili hali za mabadiliko ya tabianchi. Katibu aliongeza kwamba wakulima wa miwa watapokea mafunzo na msaada wa kiufundi kuongeza uzalishaji na kupunguza hasara zinazohusiana na aina za miwa za zamani.

Kenya yathibitisha biashara ya kimkakati na China

Mikutano hii inalenga kukusanya maoni ya wadau kuhusu Rasimu ya Muswada wa Marekebisho ya Huduma ya Uthibitisho ya Kenya, 2025, Kanuni za Uthibitisho (Za Kawaida), 2025, na Kanuni za Ada za Uthibitisho, 2025—ambazo zote zimeundwa ili kuendana na mbinu bora za kimataifa na mwenendo unaojitokeza duniani katika uthibitisho.

Wizara ya Uwekezaji, Biashara na Viwanda (MITI), kwa kushirikiana na KENAS, ilianzisha jukwaa la ushirikishwaji wa umma katika Kituo cha Uthibitisho cha Mikutano cha Kenyatta (KICC) kujadili Rasimu ya Muswada wa Marekebisho ya Huduma ya Uthibitisho ya Kenya, 2025, pamoja na Kanuni za Uthibitisho (Za Kawaida), 2025 na Kanuni za Ada za Uthibitisho, 2025, zinazolenga kuendana na mbinu bora za kimataifa na mwenendo unaojitokeza katika uthibitisho. Jukwaa hili lilijikita katika kujadili rasimu ya muswada wa marekebisho pamoja na kanuni zilizopendekezwa kuhusu utendaji wa jumla na ada za uthibitisho. Mikutano hii iliyo Nairobi inashughulikia mwanzo wa mpango wa kitaifa wa ushirikishwaji wa umma unaopangwa kuendelea kuanzia 14 Januari hadi 6 Februari 2026.

Bomet yafungua makao kwa waathiriwa wa GBV

Ili kutoa usalama na msaada wa kisaikolojia kwa waathirika wa unyanyasaji wa kijinsia (GBV), Serikali ya Kaunti ya Bomet imeanzisha nyumba salama kwa manusura. Kituo hiki, kilichoko ndani ya Kituo cha Polisi cha Bomet, kitatoa msaada wa kisaikolojia, kisheria, na kiafya kwa waathirika wa GBV wakati uchunguzi wa kesi zao unaendelea. Pia, kituo hiki ni muhimu katika kuhifadhi ushahidi ili kuhakikisha haki inatendeka kwa manusura. Gavana Prof. Hillary Barchok amesisitiza dhamira yake ya kuhakikisha kwamba waathirika wa GBV, hususan wanawake na wasichana, wanapata msaada wote wakati wa mchakato wa kisheria. “Ni jambo la kusikitisha kwamba Kaunti ya Bomet ni mojawapo ya maeneo hatarishi kwa unyanyasaji

wa kijinsia nchini. Kama serikali ya kaunti, tunachukua hatua madhubuti kushughulikia hali hii. Kituo hiki kitaunga mkono waathirika wanapofuata haki za kisheria kortini,” alisema Prof. Barchok. Gavana aliongeza kwamba utawala wake utafanya kazi kwa karibu na polisi kushughulikia visa vinyoripotiwa vya GBV na kutahadharisha kwamba yeyote atakayekutwa akihusika na kitendo hiki atakabiliana na sheria kikamilifu. Kamanda wa Kituo cha Polisi cha Bomet (OCS), Cyrus Kitetu, aliwaonya wakazi kutojishughulisha na kesi za GBV kwa nguvu zao wenyewe. “Tunawaomba wananchi wa Bomet kuripoti visa vya GBV kwa polisi. Tuta-chukua hatua kali dhidi ya wahalifu na kuonya wazazi au wanajamii dhidi ya kujaribu kutatua matendo mabaya kama haya kwa njia za siri,” alisema.
